

This is a clear case of life-threatening anaphylaxis (systemic allergic reaction); your client will die if you don't react quickly. Grab your first aid kit and give her a 0.3cc injection of epinephrine in her mid-thigh. Follow with 50 mg of Benedryl. If her respiratory distress has not resolved within 5-15 minutes OR worsens, give her a second 0.3cc injection of epinephrine.

Given the high number of wasps at all camp and lunch spots, her increased sensitivity to wasp venom, and a depletion of your epinephrine supply, begin or consider a Level 3 Evacuation as per your protocols and monitor for a return of the original S/Sx (rebound). Continue to administer 50mg of Benedryl every six hours for 24-72 hours as per your protocols. If she rebounds, administer one or more 0.3cc injections of epinephrine as required to control any respiratory distress. Take great care to avoid another wasp sting during the evacuation.
